Homeroom Updates:

Curriculum Updates:

Math (Mrs. H): Monday: *2.5 Divide Integers Tuesday: *2.6 Graph in the 4 Quadrants Wednesday: *Review Thursday: *Review Friday: *Ch. 2 Test

Math (Mrs. C): We will finish our last lesson, dividing decimals by decimals, of Chapter 3 on Monday. We will use Tuesday and Wednesday to go over the study guide and have the Chapter 3 test on Thursday, October 5th. Remember that our first ALEKS check is on Wednesday, October 4th. Students need to complete at least 10 topics. for full credit.

Math (Mr. W): Hello HRS families! On Monday, we are finishing chapter three. We will then begin chapter one: Ratios and Rates.

Monday and Tuesday: chapter three review and test prep.

Wednesday: Chapter three test.

Thursday: Continue chapter three test. Begin chapter four if students are finished. Friday: Begin 1.1 – Factors and Multiples

ELA: We are transitioning into our next unit, literary elements. We will use stories, songs, and books to review each element; characterization, theme, setting, plot, mood/tone, and inferencing. During this unit, students will learn to take notes, analyze stories to find literary elements, and use Pixar shorts to figure out the 5 elements of plot. There will be a test at the end of this unit. This unit will take about 2-3 weeks to finish. Next week, students will also be introduced to Classroom Cereal. Classroom Cereal is a series of stories that double as grammar lessons. Students will have a Classroom Cereal comprehension and grammar quiz on Friday, 10/6.

Social Studies: Next Thursday (10/5) we will have the Ch. 1, Investigating the Past

test. I have pushed out the study guide for this test on Google Classroom. Students should be reviewing/studying for this test. I will have a test review for both classes on Tuesday (10/3).

We will also be moving on to begin our study of Mesopotamia next week! Essential Question: *How did geographic challenges lead to the rise of city-states in Mesopotamia?*

Objectives : Social Studies

- Describe the location and physical setting of Mesopotamia, including the Tigris and Euphrates river system.
- Analyze geographic problems affecting ancient Mesopotamians and evaluate potential solutions.
- Describe how Mesopotamians modified their physical environment to solve geographic problems.
- Explain how the development of agricultural techniques, such as irrigation systems, led to the emergence of Sumerian city-states.

Language Arts

- Support opinions with detailed evidence and with visual or media displays that use appropriate technology.
- Deliver presentations on problems and solutions that establish connections between the defined problem and at least one solution and that offer persuasive evidence to validate the proposed solution(s).

Science: Students have conducted experiments to investigate the difference between mass and weight. Next, students will investigate magnetic forces. Students will distinguish magnetic from nonmagnetic materials. They will carry out an investigation to explore how distance from a magnet affects its magnetic field.

Religion: 6th graders will explore and compare the two Creation accounts in the Book of Genesis. They will be able to tell about God as the Creator, all of creation is good, and humans are created in God's own image and likeness. Part of our class time will be used for completion of the Old Testament poster.
