## Math (Mrs. H):

Math (Mrs. C): We will begin Chapter 7, Equations on Monday. In this chapter students will learn to solve for a variable. This is a short chapter with only 5 lessons so plan for a test in 2 weeks.

ELA: *** READ Chapter 14-15 This Weekend*** Students are doing a wonderful job with each Giver activity and in class discussion. It's amazing to hear the excitement and buzz each morning as they talk about what they read the night before. On Tuesday I will be introducing a large project called the Memory Book. In The Giver, Jonas was frustrated because he did not know his grandparents or anything about his true family. Here is your chance to dig into your family history, because unlike Jonas, you can! Students will build a family tree and memory book to learn about their own family.

Students will need to interview at least two family members (preferably from 2 different generations) and take notes. Some ideas that you may want to interview them about could include, but are not limited to, family life, childhood/play time, work life, values and culture. Most importantly, they will be looking for what events shaped his/her life. Think about the strong memories Jonas received and how those memories encouraged him to take action. These memories are to be written/typed by the student and not the family member. This project will be done mostly at home. I will have examples and directions in Google Classroom. Students will have 3 work days in class March 1st, and March 4th- 5th. This project is due Tuesday, March 12th. Students will present their memory books in small groups on March 12th.

Social Studies: Next week we will have the Lesson 12 Test on Thursday 2/15. We will be having a review on Tuesday for this test. On Wednesday we will begin Lesson 13, Daily Life in Ancient Egypt.

Science: Students will make different saturated solutions. They will use a balance scale to find the mass of the solution to determine the amount of solute that dissolved in the solution. They will then compare the solubility of different materials in water.

Religion: This week, 6th graders will wrap up our lesson in chapter 5 with highlights of events in Exodus, comparing the Scripture account to the version presented in the Prince of Egypt movie. They will also discover the connection between the Passover Meal, Last Supper and the Eucharist. We will start to talk about the Lenten season.
