ELA: We are nearing the end of our figurative language unit. It has been an exciting week with the Final Four of March Madness, Tournament of Poems. The top 4 poems were all amazing; Dreams and Mother to Son by Langston Hughes, Still I Rise by Maya Angelou, and Pretty Ugly by Abdullah Shoaib. Pretty Ugly was the winner by a close 5 votes. I was excited to see students so into poetry and fighting for their favorite. We will start reviewing for our figurative language test which will most likely take place the week after camp. Please have your child pick out another book to read for our last book

report. They should have started a new book by Wednesday, April 24 and finish reading by May 28th.

Social Studies: We are currently working on Lesson 30 The Rise of Democracy. Students are taking part in an experiential exercise to help them understand how the ancient Greeks went from a Monarchy to Democracy. Students will be learning about four forms of government: Monarchy, Oligarchy, Tyranny and Democracy. The study guide for this Lesson will be Google Classroom on 4/22. The test will be on Tuesday 4/30. **Wax Museum: The rough draft and completed Bibliography is due on April 25th on Google Classroom,**

Science: Students begin a unit in Life Science. Students will learn about the features of water and land biomes. Students will first discover the features of major land biomes: Desert, Temperate Deciduous Forest, Tropical RainForest, Tundra, and Taiga. They will complete a booklet in class to compare the features of each biome.

Religion: We will talk about Catholic Social Teaching: Care for Creation and celebrate Earth Day. Students will create posters, encouraging people to help take care of our Earth. They will also learn about the Early Church from the Book of Acts.
